

Admissions Policies and Process

Admissions Requirements

Humble Christian School evaluates applicants on the following: application information, scores from admissions exam; personal recommendation from a pastor; academic achievement; conduct and character; and a family dedication to Christian education. At least one parent/guardian needs to be a born-again believer in Christ and be active in a local church.

To start K4, a child must be 4 years old by August 1. To start Kindergarten, a child must be 5 years old by August 1. To start 1st grade, a child must be 6 years old by August 1. All applicants must be able to care for restroom needs independently.

Admissions Process

Step 1 - Submit Application

Complete the Online Application for Admission which can be found on our website, http://humblechristianschool.org/admissions. On the Admissions page, click the APPLY HERE button then follow the directions. There is a \$22 per student application fee.

Step 2 - Testing

Applicants will be contacted by a staff member of Humble Christian School to schedule testing. Testing is required for all K4 through 12th grade applicants unless the applicant can provide approved standardized test scores taken within the past year. There is a \$150 nonrefundable testing fee.

Step 3 - Interview

After testing has been completed, the applicant will be contacted to set up an interview. During the interview, the test results and application will be reviewed. You will be informed of the acceptance status at the end of the interview.

Step 4 - Enrollment

Upon acceptance, a link to Online Student Enrollment will be sent to your email. A \$350 registration fee will be due at this time along with copies of birth certificate, social security card, and immunization records.
